



Beatrice Hunter Cancer Research Institute Summer Studentship Award

Application Deadline: February 08, 2026 at 4:00pm AST

APPLICATION INFORMATION

Undergraduate students interested in cancer research are invited to apply for a Beatrice Hunter Cancer Research Institute Summer Studentship. Certain awards, such as The PEJK Real Estate Thyroid Cancer Clinical Research Summer Studentship, are open to first- and second-year medical students.

Eligibility: Applicants must be enrolled full-time in an undergraduate program at a recognized institution in Atlantic Canada at the time of application and plan to return to full-time studies following the award. Students completing their undergraduate degree in the spring and planning to begin a graduate program the following September are also eligible. Proposed projects must be cancer-related and supervised by a faculty member at an Atlantic Canadian university. First- and second-year medical students enrolled at accredited medical schools in Atlantic Canada may apply only for The PEJK Real Estate Thyroid Cancer Clinical Research Summer Studentship, and projects must be supervised by a QEII Health Sciences Centre supervisor. Projects of a commercial nature or associated with a commercial interest are not eligible. Supervisors must be BHCRI members, and each supervisor may submit a maximum of two applications.

Awards: Payment of awards will be administered through the Beatrice Hunter Cancer Research Institute (BHCRI) in partnership with the successful candidate's academic institution. Students may hold other awards concurrently; however, the research project must be the same, and the combined total of all awards may not exceed \$7,500, unless otherwise specified. Supervisors are required to provide a minimum top-up of \$2,500 to ensure trainees receive funding above their provincial minimum wage, where applicable. This top-up requirement does not apply to studentships with a total value of \$7,500, such as The PEJK Real Estate Thyroid Cancer Clinical Research Summer Studentship. Supervisors should consult their province's minimum wage guidelines when calculating any required top-up.

Responsibilities: Funded students must submit a 5–7-page final report to BHCRI within 30 days of project completion, including a project synopsis, its relevance to cancer, and key findings or conclusions; the report must be approved and signed by the supervisor and accompanied by a supervisor evaluation letter. Students and supervisors are also required to complete program evaluation forms, provided before the project ends and due within 30 days of completion. Failure to submit a satisfactory report will render the supervisor ineligible to apply to future BHCRI studentship competitions. Each student is expected to present their project at a peer-reviewed forum, research symposium, or BHCRI-approved event, with abstracts reviewed by the supervisor prior to submission. All abstracts, posters, reports, and oral presentations must acknowledge BHCRI and the funding partner, include the BHCRI logo, and contain the statement: "This project was funded by a (Insert funding partner name) Studentship Award, administered by the Beatrice Hunter Cancer Research Institute," with exact wording provided in approval letters.

PROCESS OF AWARDING FUNDS: Applications will be reviewed by a Scientific Review Committee and ranked numerically. **Please note that reviewers span a broad range of research and applications should be written so they are understood by all reviewers.** The Chair of the Scientific Review Committee will present this ranked list, together with reviewers' comments, to the BHCRI Research & Training Committee for funding consideration. Supervisors can expect to be asked to be members of future Scientific Review Committees.

Application Process: A single pdf format file of the application (please include the supervisor(s) CV) must be emailed by the February 08, 2026 to admin@bhcri.ca.

Peer review is suggested prior to submission. Please contact admin@bhcri.ca at least 2 weeks in advance of the application deadline to have your application reviewed.

RESEARCH PROJECT GUIDELINES

Provide a description of your research project on a separate page, double-spaced, 12 pt. font, with 1-inch margins, up to 500 words (approximately 2 pages).

Your description should address the following:

Explain how your research is related to cancer and how it will contribute to our understanding.

State your specific research question.

Describe your general approach and proposed methodology for addressing your question.

Explain your specific role in the project (e.g., are you part of a larger project?).

Provide an approximate timeline for the steps you have outlined.

Include references, which do not count toward the page limit. You may also include figures or tables (maximum 4 figures, one per page, up to 4 pages), which also do not count toward the page limit.

Any material beyond these limits will be removed and not considered.

If you answered "Yes" to any ethics-related questions above, you must provide a copy of the ethics approval to BHCRI before funds can be released.

Also, include a separate page (maximum 125 words, double-spaced, 12 pt. font, 1-inch margins) summarizing the ethical considerations of your project. Explain why ethics approval is required, for example: animal endpoints, treatments or injections, diet, consent forms, surveys, or other relevant procedures.

DATA ANALYSIS, INCLUDING STATISTICAL METHODOLOGY

Please provide a description of the data analysis and/or statistical methods that will be used to analyze data generated by the proposed project (e.g., methods for assessing statistical significance, bioinformatics approaches, number of repeated measures, and justification for the number of animals or human participants per group). This section must be submitted as a separate page and be no more than 125 words, double-spaced, using 12-point font and 1-inch margins.

If data analysis or statistical methods are not required, please provide a brief explanation outlining why this section is not applicable, following the same formatting and length requirements.

Your summary should include an overview of your project, explain why your research is important, and provide a clear takeaway or main message.

Formatting: Separate page, maximum 250 words, double-spaced, 12 pt. font, 1-inch margins.

By signing the application, the applicant and supervisor agree that the lay summary may be posted on BHCRI social media (website, Facebook, Twitter), used in media releases and communications, and shared with funding partners.

SUPERVISOR SIGNATURE

Award recipients must submit a 5–7 page report of their project to BHCRI within 30 days of completion. The report must include a synopsis of the project, a discussion of its relevance to cancer, and the project's findings or conclusions. The final report must be approved and signed by the supervisor and accompanied by a letter evaluating the student's performance. Students are also required to complete a program evaluation form, which will be provided before the end of the project term and due 30 days after project completion. Failure to submit a satisfactory report will make the supervisor ineligible to enter students in the next BHCRI studentship competition. Each student should present their project at a peer-reviewed forum, research symposium, or other BHCRI-approved event. Abstracts should be reviewed by the student's supervisor prior to submission.
